ACSP UPPER PRIMARY ANTI-DRUG FUTSAL TOURNAMENT RESULTS.



ACSP FAMILY BOWLING 2018




The ACSP Family Bowling 2018 for P.4 – 6 was held on July 1 2018.


WAI KRU DAY

INTERVIEW: MR. ERNEST BOLTON



“I THINK THAI TEACHERS SHOULD BECOME CLOSER TO FOREIGNERS; WE ARE FAMILY, THERE’S NO REASON TO DISTANCE OURSELVES.”

HI GUYS, it's me Best again! Today I'm here with Tiya and Khawjao, we are here to interview one of the most important people in ACSP who has just retired. His name is Mr. Ernie! We are sure that you guys have heard a lot but don't really know much about him, what he has done in his life and in ACSP. You will be amazed with his accomplishments. Let's go interview him!!

Q : How did you end up in Thailand?

I had some political and personal issues. Along the way, I worked for a U.S. company and I had a successful business in Burma but the U.S. placed a sanction on it, I then decided to come to Thailand and to wait until the sanction was lifted. I ultimately decided to live here in Thailand permanently. I have been to a lot of places in the world throughout my life. I know the world pretty well.

Q : What is your achievement in life?

I got to do something in my life that a few people get to do (Flying on Air Force One for the U.S. President). When you say what is your achievement in life, mine is that I got to work with the President of the United States and helped design the airplane.

Q: Why did you decide to retire from working for the White House?

When I worked for the White House, it was the best job to have. The problem is that when you are in that position, you don't have any time that belongs to you, so I decided it was time to do something else.

Q: Any advice for students that want to be pilots?

A lot of concentration and practice I would say. But if you want to do it, do it and you will become successful. It is not hard to become a pilot but you have to have the mindset to be able to be a good pilot.

Q: What was your first job at ACSP?

Primary 6 teacher with Miss. Ratchanard which lasted for one year,

then they made me Head of Foreign Teachers. I have been the Head of Foreign Teachers for 14 years. This year the school decided that I was too old to be here, so I retired after 15 years in ACSP.

Q: Do you like teaching or Managing more?

Managing because teaching is hard. I'd always end up with playing with the kids at the end of the class. So, I decided to do something different, which worked out great.

Q : Best moment in ACSP?

Too much to say!! Pretty much anything that you could think of for fourteen years of doing this job. But the best one would be when I met Miss. Bee. (his wife)

Q : What do you feel about your job as a Head of Foreign Teachers in ACSP?

I enjoyed it, although, it took a lot of time - lots of paperwork! Sometimes working from eight o'clock in the morning to three o'clock in the afternoon. But when I really ran the job, it ran twenty-four hours a day and seven days in a week. But, I enjoyed the job very much and I have to say that I hated to have to leave it.

Q : What have been the best changes/improvements in ACSP?

When I came here, EP wasn't here and we only had 6 foreign teachers. Now, we've got 84 foreign teachers. Improvement wise, there have been a lot of positive improvements during my time in the school. I've witnessed a lot of construction here in ACSP.

I think Thai teachers should become closer to foreigners; we are family, there's no reason to distance ourselves. Thais should not look down on us and we should not look down on Thais. Thais should also learn how to think more internationally. We should learn to adapt because every culture is different.

Q : As you mentioned before that you have been in so many countries, where is your favorite tourist destination?

I have to say it is probably Thailand. I really like it here. If not Thailand, it would be China or Philippines.

Q : What is your favorite food?

Definitely medium-rare steak, French fries, and salad. On the Thai side, som-tum, moo namtok and nam prik.

Q : What is your favorite football team? What team do you cheer for FIFA?

I like the Dallas Cowboys. And for World Cup football, I guess I cheer for England for FIFA this year.

Q : Which State are you from?

I was born and raised in North Carolina, I served in the Air Force for 24 years and then I made Oklahoma my home state.

Q : You are an still an American?

Yes, I am still an American, I still hold an American passport and I can still vote!

Q : What do you do in your free time?

Spend time with my friends I have made over the years at ACSP.

Q : What do you like the most about living in Thailand?

Climate and food because in the U.S. it's very cold, I also like spicy food. I've lived here for 15 years permanently and I have been coming here for 25 years. I have not been back to the U.S. since April of 1995.

Q : What is the change that you want to make in Thai society?

During my time in the Air Force, I have been to almost every country in the world, I have met a lot of world leaders at one point. For myself, I felt very lucky in a lot of ways to be able to learn so much about the world. I also experienced a lot of cultures. I have eaten things that you could never think about and that is all about culture. I learned and so I understand differences in cultures. Once you have learned the culture, you respect it.

Thailand has a lot of good culture, very good, but also have some that's okay. Some things are very good in Thai culture but somethings are not so good so we have to balance it. It is a give and take. I think that it would be good in the long run for our students and teachers in ACSP to learn what's going on outside Thailand. So that's why I said, how to bridge some of the gap and it is not going to happen overnight, it might not happen in your lifetime but if you get a chance to make it improve or to make it easier, do it.

Q : If you can change one rule about the school, what would it be to make the school better?

One rule..... I would change all of your uniforms and let you wear what you would like to wear in the school to show your culture. Like in the Western world, we don't have a strict uniform to wear but you must wear something polite. Everybody wears what they want to wear. If you want to wear a skirt, wear a skirt. I think if you take some of the restrictions off, life will become easier. Which is more important - wearing school uniform or what you learn up here? (He pointed at his head)

That would be a start. Let's go this way, wear a student uniform four days a week and then have a day where student are allow to wear something they like. That what I call to be informal and to be formal. Student uniforms have nothing to do with

Q : Do you believe that we can make all those things happen?

Sure! This school has come a long way compared to when I was (first) here. A lot of things have changed in many positive ways. But the question is, how can you keep it and make the school more interesting to make the student want to



increasing your education. First thing is to make the place where it is fun to come and learn. Take the uniform off and yeah that's fine but we will still keep the student assembly.

Another thing that I wanted to see in the school, and I think it would be exciting, is the school cuts the classes down and gives one teacher their own room, and then let the kids walk to the classes like we do in the western world. Each teacher would all have a homeroom with all students that they will know all by their heart. They will know all students' weak and strong sides. I think it would work better than the rotating teaching style. I think that by cutting some small changes off like this it will change the learning curve in this school drastically. But we have to be brave enough to take the step.

This would improve learning because when you enter a classroom the environment is unique to that classroom. For example, when you are in World Cultural Center, you would be surrounded by history environment.

Also, I think that we should have a locker system so students don't have to carry a lot of books around. In the western world, we have a gap between each period to go get books.

learn? At some point you have to take some of the restrictions off and let every people have some freedom to think. Let's try it out! If it is not working right, we change it but if it works that will benefit us. The improvement has to come.

Q : Do you anything to say to the students?

I think the students here are very nice and polite. I am going to miss the place and I will come back and visit, that's for sure. I will miss all students that I have seen and grown up with and everyone here. I wish all of them here the best of luck in the future. I hope that I will see some of you in high places in the future and remember that we had a conversation together and make Thailand better.

I appreciate the opportunity to talk with you this morning. It has been a blast to talk with all of you! Even though I am out of the school, I am close by. If you need anything, please don't hesitate to ask! I will try my best to help you!!

I really want to say that we all really do appreciate all of your hard work and efforts that you put it to this school and especially in English Program. Thank you Say the same to you here! 




FIFA WORLD CUP 2018

The 2018 FIFA World Cup was full of shocking and unpredictable moments. Who would have thought that Croatia, a team from a small country with a population of 4 million people, would get through to the final? Who would have thought that Argentina, the two-time FIFA World Cup champion, would draw against Iceland, a team taking part in their first World Cup? And who would have thought that Germany, the 2014 FIFA World Cup winner and the highest-ranked team in the tournament, will lose to South Korea, the 5th-lowest-ranked team in the tournament, and be eliminated in the first round?

After a month long of thrilling and fascinating football matches, the 2018 FIFA World Cup finally came to the end. It was France vs. Belgium and England vs. Croatia in the semifinals. Belgium's performance was superb throughout the match, but unluckily they got eliminated by France in a 1 – 0 victory. Croatia then caught up with France after Ivan Perišić scored a goal in the twentieth minute. 10 minutes after that, Croatia received a penalty because of a hand-ball in the penalty area, and it was Antoine Griezmann who took the penalty kick and put France back into the lead, the first half ending with France 2 – 1 Croatia. Then early in the second half, Paul Pogba and Kylian Mbappé from France scored, extending the lead by 4 – 1. Croatia, however, still did not give up. Mario Mandžukić scored a consolation goal for Croatia in the sixty ninth minute before the match ended with the score 4 – 2, resulting in France being the two-time FIFA World Cup winner, 1998 & 2018. Belgium earned the second place by winning against England in a 2 – 0 victory.


You and your friends will start off with a 2x2 size raft. You can expand your raft size by using a hook to get the debris around the ocean. Of course, as a survival game, the food mechanism applies; the player must find food and water. The players will need to craft a glass and a fishing rod to hook up fish and distill seawater into a drinkable water. But be careful when you're out fishing as you know in deep waters there are bound to be sharks swimming around the water and lurking around you as they smell blood from your body.

Every 5 to 10 minutes, a block of your raft gets removed by a shark, which is really irritating as it also breaks your furniture on the block. To replace the furniture, you will need to place the block back again. Luckily, there is a way to defeat sharks, you can craft a spear to fight the sharks,

and killing them allows you to obtain its meat for food. You can also navigate your ship to an island that is rich in natural resources.

After 12-24 hours worth of gameplay, you should be able to craft almost everything in the game. The graphics on the game are absolutely amazing, the islands look very realistic. It is a shame that you can't build on it, but the developers might update the game as it is still a relatively new game. The scenery in the game is absolutely top-notch, in the water the plants and debris look realistic, the moon looks amazing and the water is so clear it looks like a paradise.

There might still be some bugs and unrealistic features within the game such as you needing to eat 64 fish in order to become full or having no fish underwater but only a great white shark. But overall, I think this game has a lot of great features, good graphics, beautiful terrains, great to play co-op with friends and the underwater scenery is beautiful as well. A great game comes with a great price and for 369 baht it is a great game to have.



In other battle royale games, after your HP goes below zero you will die or become knocked out but in Realm Royale you transform into a chicken for thirty seconds, you can move as a chicken to run away or hide from enemies. After thirty seconds you return to human form with only half HP.


The looting system in this game is quite similar to other battle royale games but you can only find loots from chests and crates around the map, as well as supply drops which would be the only




CONSPIRACY THEORY ABOUT ALIENS
